5. CCS Athletic Handbook and By Laws

Inman introduced the agenda item and said, "The only change is on page 12, if you have a manual. I will let Mr. Patton explain to you what we are doing." Patton stated, "If you look on page 12, what we have added to the athletic procedures manual is number 6 and 7. Number six says private schools may apply for athletic co-op agreements with Cumberland County Schools, which is what we just did. Granting of such Co-op agreements will be at the discretion of the Board of education and must be approved annually. That is what we have been doing in practice, we just wanted to get it on paper. Number 7 again one of those things we have been doing in practice, but we just wanted to get on paper; Athletes form approved home schools, private school co-ops, and I added, and/or other non-traditional schools must participate at the school for which they would normally be zoned. Inman made a motion to approve as presented.

Bylaw Additions / Changes

1) Universal ticket pricing for middle and elementary sports? Amount?

2) Season Tickets

Set by individual schools

Based on number of contests

Adult / Student season ticket

3) Filming / Videoing -

No filming / Videoing of opponents

4) Homeschool Transfer rule –

Current bylaw – Elementary, Middle, and High School home-schooled students must play where zoned, regardless of change of residence. Meaning they must transfer teams if they change residence into a new school zone. (just as public-school students)

Need change or allowance for High School home-schooled athletes relative to TSSAA rule:

Rationale:

TSSAA will not allow a transfer of homeschool students once an athletic record is established at a particular school.

Suggest that secondary homeschooled students start their career where zoned and finish at the same, regardless of change of residence.
