1 The Executive Committee of the Board shall be responsible for developing an agenda for each board  
2 meeting. Any board member may recommend items to be placed on the agenda for discussion. The  
3 particular order may vary from meeting to meeting in keeping with the business at hand.

4  
5 The agenda (which shall include the consent agenda), together with supporting materials, shall be given  
6 to board members at least one (1) day prior to the scheduled date of the meeting. The agenda shall be  
7 available for public inspection when it is distributed to the board members. At the beginning of each  
8 meeting the Board shall, by a majority vote, approve changes in the agenda for the meeting, which may  
9 involve the addition to or deletion of items previously included on the agenda. The Board, however,  
10 may not revise board policies or adopt new ones, unless such action has been scheduled.

11  
12 Staff members or citizens of the district may suggest items for the agenda by presenting proposed items  
13 to the director of schools or the chairman of the Board.

14  
15 For items to be considered on the agenda, they must be received in the director of schools' office at  
16 least seven (7) days prior to the scheduled date of the meeting. The person(s) requesting an item on the  
17 agenda shall forward any background information to the director of schools' office so that the material  
18 will be included in the delivery to the board members prior to the meeting.

19  
20 The agenda for regular meetings shall ordinarily allow suitable time for the remarks of those members  
21 of the public who wish to speak.

22  
23 Citizens wishing to address the Board must follow guidelines set forth in policy *Appeals to and*  
24 *Appearances Before the Board* (1.404).

## 25 26 **CONSENT AGENDA**

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28 While developing the agenda, the chair and director of schools shall identify routine or non-controversial  
29 items to be placed on the consent agenda, which shall become a part of the regular agenda. If any  
30 member objects to including an item on the consent agenda, that item shall be moved to the regular  
31 agenda as an action item requiring discussion. The remaining consent items may be adopted in a single  
32 vote without discussion.

## 1 *General*

2 To attain tenure status, a teacher must: (1) meet tenure eligibility requirements; (2) be renewed and  
3 recommended by the director of schools;<sup>1</sup> and (3) receive a majority vote of the board.

## 4 **TENURE ELIGIBILITY<sup>2</sup>**

5 Teachers that meet the following requirements are eligible for tenure:

- 6 1. Has a degree from an approved four-year college or any career and technical teacher who has the  
7 equivalent amount of training established and is licensed by the state board of education;
- 8 2. Holds a valid teacher license issued by the state board of education, based on training covering  
9 the subjects or grades taught;
- 10 3. Has completed a probationary period of five (5) school years or not less than forty-five (45)  
11 months within the last seven-year period, the last two (2) years being employed in a regular  
12 teaching position rather than an interim teaching position; and
- 13 4. Has received evaluations demonstrating an overall performance effectiveness level of “above  
14 expectations” or “significantly above expectations” as provided in the evaluation guidelines  
15 adopted by the state board of education, during the last two (2) years of the probationary period.

## 16 **ACQUISITION OF TENURE STATUS**

17 Once a teacher is eligible for tenure, he/she shall be either recommended by the director of schools for  
18 tenure or non-renewed. If tenure is denied by the board, the teacher shall be dismissed.<sup>3</sup>

19 The following additional guidelines shall apply:

- 20 1. The director of schools will recommend persons eligible for tenure at a board meeting in ample  
21 time to provide notice of non-renewal to each teacher not recommended for tenure within five  
22 (5) business days following the last instructional day for the school year.<sup>4</sup>
- 23 2. The decision to grant tenure is solely within the discretion of the board.<sup>5</sup> Only those teachers who  
24 receive a majority vote of the membership of the board will be granted tenure.<sup>6</sup>
- 25 3. A teacher who is eligible for tenure, but tenure is denied by the board, shall not be rehired beyond  
26 the current contract year.<sup>7</sup>

## 27 **TEACHER RETURNING TO EMPLOYMENT**

28 A teacher who has acquired tenure status in the school system and later resigns shall serve a two-year  
29 probationary period upon reemployment, unless the probationary period is waived by the board upon  
30 request of the director of schools. Upon completion of the two-year period, the teacher shall either be

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1 recommended by the director of schools for tenure or non-renewed. If tenure is denied by the board, the  
2 teacher shall be dismissed.<sup>7</sup>

### 3 **TEACHER TRANSFERRING FROM ANOTHER SCHOOL SYSTEM<sup>8</sup>**

4 A tenured or non-tenured teacher with five (5) or more years of prior service that transfers from another  
5 school system to begin employment in the Marshall County School System shall serve the regular  
6 probationary period. The board, upon the recommendation of the director of schools, may waive the  
7 probationary period and grant tenure status or shorten the probationary period.

8 If a non-tenured teacher with fewer than five (5) years of service transfers from another school system,  
9 such teacher shall not be eligible for tenure status until the teacher has served at least five (5) years when  
10 service in both school systems is counted.

11 All tenure decisions made under this section are subject to the requirements concerning overall teacher  
12 performance effectiveness levels.

### 13 **TEACHER RETURNING TO PROBATIONARY STATUS<sup>9</sup>**

14 Any tenured teacher who receives two (2) consecutive years of evaluations demonstrating an overall  
15 performance effectiveness level of “below expectations” or “significantly below expectations” shall be  
16 returned to probationary status by the director of schools until the teacher has received two (2)  
17 consecutive years of evaluations demonstrating an overall performance effectiveness level of “above  
18 expectations” or “significantly above expectations.”

19 When a teacher who has returned to probationary status has received two (2) consecutive years of  
20 evaluations demonstrating an overall performance effectiveness level of “above expectations” or  
21 “significantly above expectations,” the teacher is again eligible for tenure and shall be either  
22 recommended by the director of schools for tenure or non-renewed, provided, however, that the teacher  
23 shall be dismissed if tenure is denied by the board.

24 This section does not apply to teachers who acquired tenure prior to July 1, 2011.

1 The Board shall operate without standing committees, except for the Executive Committee; however,  
2 special committees composed of board members may be appointed by the chairman at the direction of the  
3 Board and as the needs of the Board shall require.<sup>1</sup> Such committees shall be discharged when the work  
4 is finished or earlier by a majority vote of the entire Board. All reports by special committees shall be  
5 made directly to the Board.

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- 7 1. Special committees shall be appointed by the chairman serving in an advisory capacity shall  
8 ordinarily consist of less than a quorum of board members;
- 9
- 10 2. The committee will be advisory only unless specifically authorized to transact designated business;
- 11
- 12 3. General issues to be discussed by the committee must be approved in advance by the entire Board;
- 13
- 14 4. A committee shall serve no longer than the annual organization meeting of the Board unless  
15 reappointed to finish a designated task; and
- 16
- 17 5. Committee meetings shall be held in accordance with the Open Meetings law.<sup>2</sup>

1 The Executive Committee of the Board shall be responsible for developing an agenda for each board  
2 meeting. Any board member may recommend items to be placed on the agenda for discussion. The  
3 particular order may vary from meeting to meeting in keeping with the business at hand.

5 The agenda (which shall include the consent agenda), together with supporting materials, shall be given  
6 to board members at least one (1) day prior to the scheduled date of the meeting. The agenda shall be  
7 available for public inspection when it is distributed to the board members. At the beginning of each  
8 meeting the Board shall, by a majority vote, approve changes in the agenda for the meeting, which may  
9 involve the addition to or deletion of items previously included on the agenda. The Board, however,  
10 may not revise board policies or adopt new ones, unless such action has been scheduled.  
11

12 Staff members or citizens of the district may suggest items for the agenda by presenting proposed items  
13 to the director of schools or the chairman of the Board.  
14

15 For items to be considered on the agenda, they must be received in the director of schools' office at  
16 least seven (7) days prior to the scheduled date of the meeting. The person(s) requesting an item on the  
17 agenda shall forward any background information to the director of schools' office so that the material  
18 will be included in the delivery to the board members prior to the meeting.  
19

20 The agenda for regular meetings shall ordinarily allow suitable time for the remarks of those members  
21 of the public who wish to speak.  
22

23 Citizens wishing to address the Board must follow guidelines set forth in policy *Appeals to and*  
24 *Appearances Before the Board* (1.404).

## 26 **CONSENT AGENDA**

27  
28 While developing the agenda, the chair and director of schools shall identify routine or non-controversial  
29 items to be placed on the consent agenda, which shall become a part of the regular agenda. If any  
30 member objects to including an item on the consent agenda, that item shall be moved to the regular  
31 agenda as an action item requiring discussion. The remaining consent items may be adopted in a single  
32 vote without discussion.

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The MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS (OWNER) and STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. (CONSULTANT) agree that CONSULTANT will perform the professional services set forth in Attachment A upon the following terms and conditions:

1.     **TERM.** This Agreement shall be in effect for the Term stated in Attachment A unless it is extended by written agreement of the parties or sooner terminated as set forth in this Agreement.
2.     **SCOPE.** STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. agrees to perform ROOF EMERGENCY REPAIRS AND MANAGEMENT SERVICES as specifically requested by MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS and as generally described in Attachment A. The Job Description for the position for which CONSULTANT’S services are engaged is set forth in Attachment C. It is specifically understood by both parties that the terms of this Agreement apply only to the ROOF EMERGENCY REPAIRS, ROOF REPLACEMENTS, AND ROOF MANAGEMENT SERVICES described in Attachment A and that no Agreement is being entered into with respect to any ROOF EMERGENCY REPAIRS, ROOF REPLACEMENTS, AND ROOF MANAGEMENT SERVICES not described in Attachment A.
3.     **RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES.** The parties agree that the STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. is an independent CONSULTANT and MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS has no right to control how the work is performed other than as specified for requirements as stated in Attachment A. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. understands that no relationship other than that of contracting parties is established by this Agreement, and further understands that this does not establish any employer-employee arrangement. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. agrees, as an Independent CONSULTANT, to treat its assistants as its own employees and comply with tax requirements for STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. and its assistants.
4.     **LABOR.** STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. agrees it is solely responsible for providing the labor to achieve the specified requirements of Attachment A. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. agrees that MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS shall not provide training for STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. to perform services specified in Attachment A. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. agrees to be available to MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS on an as needed basis, and that the hours of labor are not ordinarily established by MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. understands it is free to work for any number of other persons or firms simultaneously.
5.     **FEES AND EXPENSES.** For all services rendered by STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. under this Agreement, STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. shall be paid in accordance with Attachment B. Unless otherwise specifically set forth in Attachment B, such payments shall be made net 15 and in no instance more than 30 days after the receipt of an invoice by MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS.

STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC.'s relationship shall be that of an independent CONSULTANT and MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS shall not withhold taxes or Social Security payments from any sum paid to STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. under this Agreement.

6.     **INSURANCE.** STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. shall maintain during the term of this Agreement, at STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC.'s sole expense, such insurance as stated in Exhibit 1.

STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. shall provide prior to start of operation under this Agreement evidence of the level of insurance indicated in Exhibit 1 by STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. The failure of either party at any time to enforce any right or remedy available to it under this Agreement with respect to any breach or failure by the other party shall not be construed to be a waiver of such right or remedy with respect to any other breach or failure by the other party.
10. LAW. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee.
11. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement, the terms and conditions of the Attachments and Exhibits hereto and amendments mutually agreed upon in writing are the complete and entire agreement regarding these transactions, and replace any prior oral or written communications between MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS and STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. hereby warrants and represents that it is not subject to any restriction, penalty, agreement, commitment, law, rule, regulation or order which is violated by its execution and delivery of this Agreement and performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
12. GUARANTEE. Roof repair work performed under the management of, under the supervision of, and or under the direction of STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. and or its subcontractors under this Agreement thereof for MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS shall be guaranteed for a period of no less than one year.
13. NON-SOLICITATION. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. shall not solicit or recruit any employee or manager of MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS during the duration of this Agreement and for a period of two years following the termination of this Agreement. MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS shall not solicit or recruit any employee or manager of STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. during the duration of this Agreement and for a period of two years following the termination of this Agreement.
14. PROJECT STAFFING AND PROCESS. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. has provided MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS with the names of the individuals who will be staffing this project along with their positions and their contact information for this project within Attachment A.
15. ADVERTISING. Any and all language STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. may use in advertising for the solicitation of contractors to perform work of this Agreement must be submitted to MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS prior to its placement or use and may only be used with MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS's written consent.
16. CONSULTANT'S CERTIFICATION PACKAGE. A CONSULTANT'S certification package including a Vendor Certification Form, a statement of non-disbarment, e-Verify certificate of compliance, and a W-9 form must be completed by STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. and submitted to MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS.

17. GENERAL.

- A. Acknowledgments. Acceptance of this Agreement must be in accordance with and strictly limited to the terms and conditions contained herein. Any attempted acknowledgment or acceptance which contains provisions conflicting or additional to the terms and conditions of this Agreement or which varies any term or condition shall have no force or effect. Performance by STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. without an effective acknowledgment shall be deemed to be performance in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- B. Invoices. Render a separate invoice for each Work Order issued by MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS. All items on invoice must conform to fee items listed in Attachment B of this Agreement. Invoice must show MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS's Agreement number. Deliver or mail invoice (s) and statements to MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS address set forth at the top of page 1 of this Agreement.
- C. Interest Charged on Invoices. Interest charges referenced on an invoice will apply only after payment is not rendered to STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. after thirty (30) days from the date of the invoice. Allowed interest on unpaid invoices will be the prevailing current prime interest rate plus 2% per annum.
- D. Termination. This Agreement can be terminated for convenience before expiration by either MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS or STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. given that written notice is provided to the other party at least thirty (30) days prior to the termination date. The amount, if any, which will be owed by MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS to STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. (or STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. to MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS) upon Termination is set forth in Attachment B. To the extent that Attachment B does not specifically set forth any financial liability of MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS upon Termination, the MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS shall not have any such obligation.
- E. Indemnification. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. hereby undertakes and agrees to forever indemnify and hold harmless MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS of Lewisburg, Tennessee and its Board of Education Members, individually and collectively, its subsidiaries and officers, agents, servants and employees of MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS, from any and all such losses, expenses, damages (including loss of use), demands and claims, and shall defend any suit or action brought against them, or any of them, based on any alleged injury (including death) or damage (including loss of use) arising out of performance of the work under this Agreement and shall pay all damages, judgments, costs, and expenses including attorney's fees in connection with said damages and claims resulting therefrom. The foregoing assumption, indemnification, hold harmless and undertaking of defense shall not apply to any loss, damage, expense, demand, claims or cause of action arising out of, or caused by the sole negligence of MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS and its Board of Education Members, individually or collectively, its subsidiaries or officers, agents, servants or employees of MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS.
- F. Confidentiality. So long as this Agreement remains in effect, STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. may have access to and become acquainted with various trade secrets, consisting of management, financial, and operational materials, and methods and processes, and compilations of information, and records and specifications of MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS, which are owned by MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS and which are regularly used in the operation of MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS's business. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. acknowledges such information is secret and confidential and that MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS disclosed the same to STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. shall not disclose any such secrets, directly or indirectly, or use them in any other way either during the term of this Agreement or at any time thereafter, except as required in the course of its performance in accordance with this Agreement. All files, records, documents, drawings, specifications, equipment, and similar items relating to business at MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS, whether prepared by STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. or those acting on behalf of STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC., shall remain the property of MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS and shall be treated in a confidential manner by STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. so as to safeguard its proprietary nature.

- H. Changes. Except as otherwise provided herein, no payment for extra work shall be made unless such extras and the price thereof have been authorized in writing by MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS.

- J. Assignment. MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS may not at any time assign any of its rights hereunder of this Agreement or assign their fundamental operations and responsibilities of this Agreement to an outside management services firm. Neither this Agreement, nor any payments, claims, or interests thereunder are assignable or transferable by STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. without MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS'S written approval.
- K. Equal Opportunity. During the performance of this Agreement, STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. agrees to as follows:
  - i. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, or origin. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this Equal Opportunity article.

**Term of Agreement:**

The term of this Agreement shall be effective for a period of one year commencing as of May 20, 2020 and ending on May 20, 2021. This Agreement may be extended by mutual consent of both parties with a written notification by either party to the other at any time prior to the ending date of this Agreement. Extension of this Agreement will be on yearly basis with a maximum of two (2) extensions per Agreement.

**Scope of Work to be Performed by STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC.:**

STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. will, at the direction of MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS OPERATIONS DEPARTMENT, perform roof emergency repairs and management services on MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS facilities as follows:

1. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. will prepare a roof repair service and roof replacement package for qualified roof contractor pricing for an 'Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) Roof Construction Repair & Replacement' contract.
2. MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS OPERATIONS DEPARTMENT will provide notice to STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. via telephone, facsimile, email, texting, and or verbal of a request for emergency roof repair service. This form of notice will be followed by a written Work Order Authorization provided to STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC.;
3. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC., will respond to all notifications and notices by scheduling a Roof Specialist or Roof Observer/Inspector to visit the subject school facility and perform an analysis and investigation of the issues reported. The Roof Specialist or Roof Observer/Inspector will report to the Primary Roof Program Manager all findings of the roof issues pertaining to the emergency roof repair service request submitted by MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS OPERATIONS DEPARTMENT. The Roof Specialist or Roof Observer/Inspector will be instructed to make certain repairs in order to mitigate damage to the interior of the building in order to minimize the risk for potential life-safety issues for students, teachers, employees, and another public persons;
4. STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. Primary Roof Program Manager will assess the found reported conditions and determine the proper recourse to resolve the emergency roof repair service issue. The following are recourse actions the Primary Roof Program Manager will make to resolve the emergency roof repair service order:
  - A. Where current warranty coverage exists, the roof warranty provider will be notified; the roof system manufacturer, the general contractor, and or both parties.
  - B. Where no current warranty coverage exists, determine a projected estimated cost for the repairs and,
    - i. On roof repairs and/or roof replacements, STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. will prepare a scope of work for the emergency roof repairs for the contract pricing by the IDIQ Roof Contractor including all required drawings, specifications, and material requirements; contractor pricing, based on the Roof Contractor's IDIQ Unit Price Agreement, will be provided to MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS OPERATIONS DEPARTMENT for review and approval.
    - ii. On scheduled and planned roof replacements, MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS OPERATIONS DEPARTMENT will notify STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. and a scope of work for the roof replacements will be prepared in accordance with the IDIQ Unit Price Agreement including all required drawings, specifications, and material requirements. This scope of work and all related documents will be provided to the MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS OPERATIONS

DEPARTMENT for further processing and approvals before any work is undertaken.

- C. In the occurrence of undetermined causation of leaks and or water intrusion, the Primary Roof Program Manager may order or will conduct additional testing as deemed necessary. This testing will be to further investigate and determine the exact causation of the leaks and or water intrusion. Testing that may be performed are water testing roof top mechanical units and roof flashings; water testing curtainwall assemblies per AAMA 501.2; water testing masonry walls through wall flashings per AAMA 501.2; and air chamber pressure testing of curtainwall and or storefronts per AAMA 501.1.
5. The IDIQ Roof Contractor performing emergency roof repair service work will provide MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS with a one (1) year guarantee on the work performed; or, for roof replacements, the IDIQ Roof Contractor will provide a Contractors Labor & Materials 5-Year Roof Guarantee and a specified roof system manufacturer warranty for 20-years.
  6. The IDIQ Roof Contractor reserves the right to not provide any warranty or guarantee on roofs that have extensive deterioration and degradation conditions. In this occurrence, STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC. will notify MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS in writing of this exclusion.
  7. Payments are not contingent on the successful repair of any roof where work is coordinated by STEPHEN WARD & ASSOCIATES, INC.

**ATTACHMENT 'B' – Fees and Expenses**

\$1,000,000 each professional act, error or omission,  
\$1,000,000 aggregate for all professional acts, errors or omissions

C. Other Insurance Provisions

1. Claims-Made Coverage

If the professional liability insurance required by this section is written on a "claims-made" policy form, the policy and all certificates of insurance as required hereunder shall show the "retroactive date." If the "retroactive date" is later than the date of this Agreement and the CONSULTANT was previously insured under a "claims-made" professional liability insurance policy during any portion of the period between the date of this Agreement and the "retroactive date" of the CONSULTANT'S current "claims-made" professional liability insurance policy, the CONSULTANT shall furnish a Certificate of Insurance showing that the CONSULTANT has purchased the "extended reporting period" or "supplemental tail" endorsement under the previous policy to extend the period during which a claim may first be made.

2. MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS as additional insured

MARSHALL COUNTY SCHOOLS, its Board members, officers, directors, trustees, volunteers, and employees (Additional Insureds) shall be named as additional insureds under the Commercial General Liability policy, and the policy shall stipulate that the insurance afforded the Additional Insureds shall apply as primary insurance and that any other insurance carried by the Additional Insureds will be excess only and will not contribute with CONSULTANT'S insurance. CONSULTANT shall include all subcontractors to the CONSULTANT as insured under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates for each subcontractor to the CONSULTANT. All coverages for subcontractor to the CONSULTANT shall be subject to all of the requirements stated herein.

7 report will show the amount of the annual appropriation, the amount expended by account to date, the  
8 amount encumbered and the free balance in each account.

10 The director of schools shall submit monthly financial reports to the Board and to state and federal  
11 agencies as required.<sup>3</sup>

13 **FINANCIAL RECORDS**

15 The director of schools shall maintain all financial records as required by regulation and applicable state and  
16 federal law. The Board, from time to time, may determine to extend the retention time for certain records.<sup>4</sup>
