3.B.2. Model United Nations

Model UN teachers, Julie Phillips and Athena Davis, reported that the group returned yesterday after attending the 20th Annual Washington Area Model United Nations Conference hosted by George Washington University. 3.B.3. CHS Wrestling Team

Autumn O'Bryan, CHS Principal, introduced the State Champion CHS Wrestling Team. The team record was 34-1; the only loss was to a nationally ranked team. They won several tournaments including state duals and tradition

championships. There were eight state placers, two state finalists, and one state champion, Austin Sweeney.

Dr. Dyer also recognized CHS student, Elena Burton. Miss Burton is the Distinguished Young Woman of Cleveland this year.

3.C. School Safety Resource Update

Scotty Hernandez, Safety Resource Coordinator, provided an update on safety. Highlights included:

Video surveillance systems have been updated at all schools except Denning Center. Denning Center will be updated soon. This has been a six year process.

Radio communications are running at 100%. We will transition to 800mhz (digital) soon.

OSHA recorded injuries (anything beyond first aid) is up this year although we are still below the national average. After review, the increase in injuries is the coaching and special education staff.

TOSHA Plan - We have until October 2018 to implement our program; this has been a two year process. Written plan will be finished in 30-45 days, then he and Hal Taylor will implement.

We are continuing with the ALICE program which is an active shooter training.
